Dear Lambeth Impact Circle members:

It is a privilege to reach out again to the amazing donors whose support makes our work possible. Some of you are new to the Lambeth Impact Circle, and I would encourage you to go to our website (<u>www.maryhurst.org/lambeth-impact-circle</u>) to read about how this donor recognition program started and what it means for Maryhurst. Because of your investment in our work, I want to provide you a deeper look at both our challenges and celebrations than we would include in our traditional mailings.

CHALLENGES

Staffing recruitment and retention is our #1 challenge -

- Maryhurst is the only agency serving adolescent girls with the highest treatment needs in the state's child welfare system. We provide 24-hour care to children who have experienced severe trauma and need consistency and strong relationships with staff to feel safe. Low staffing directly impacts treatment.
- As with many helping professions, being exposed to the trauma that our youth have endured can cause its own trauma in our staff. Having to cover extra shifts for weeks at a time significantly impacts our staff's ability to re-charge and care for themselves.
- Maryhurst has raised the starting wages for our direct care staff by 30-35% in the past year to stay competitive. The resulting increase in our expenses (an estimated \$1.35 million) is not covered by our established reimbursement rates.
- We are working to improve employee retention by improving the first-90-days experience for staff, increasing appreciation activities, and further investing in diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts.
- With support from our board, Maryhurst leadership is meeting with key lawmakers to seek reimbursement increases as Kentucky draws up its next two-year budget.
- Maryhurst is also advocating for increased Medicaid rates for our communitybased counseling services that aim to keep families intact and eliminate the need for residential care.

- <u>Campus Naming Event</u> On April 14th (6:00 8:00 pm EDT), Maryhurst will officially name our Dorsey Lane property the Lambeth Campus in honor of Judy Lambeth who led this agency for 30 years as President and CEO. The pandemic prevented us from celebrating Judy in the way she deserved when she retired in 2020, but this event will allow us to publicly thank her for her leadership and vision. All of you should have received an invitation, and I look forward to celebrating with you. The event will take place on our Lambeth Campus (1015 Dorsey Lane), and we will livestream the ceremony for those who cannot be with us in person.
